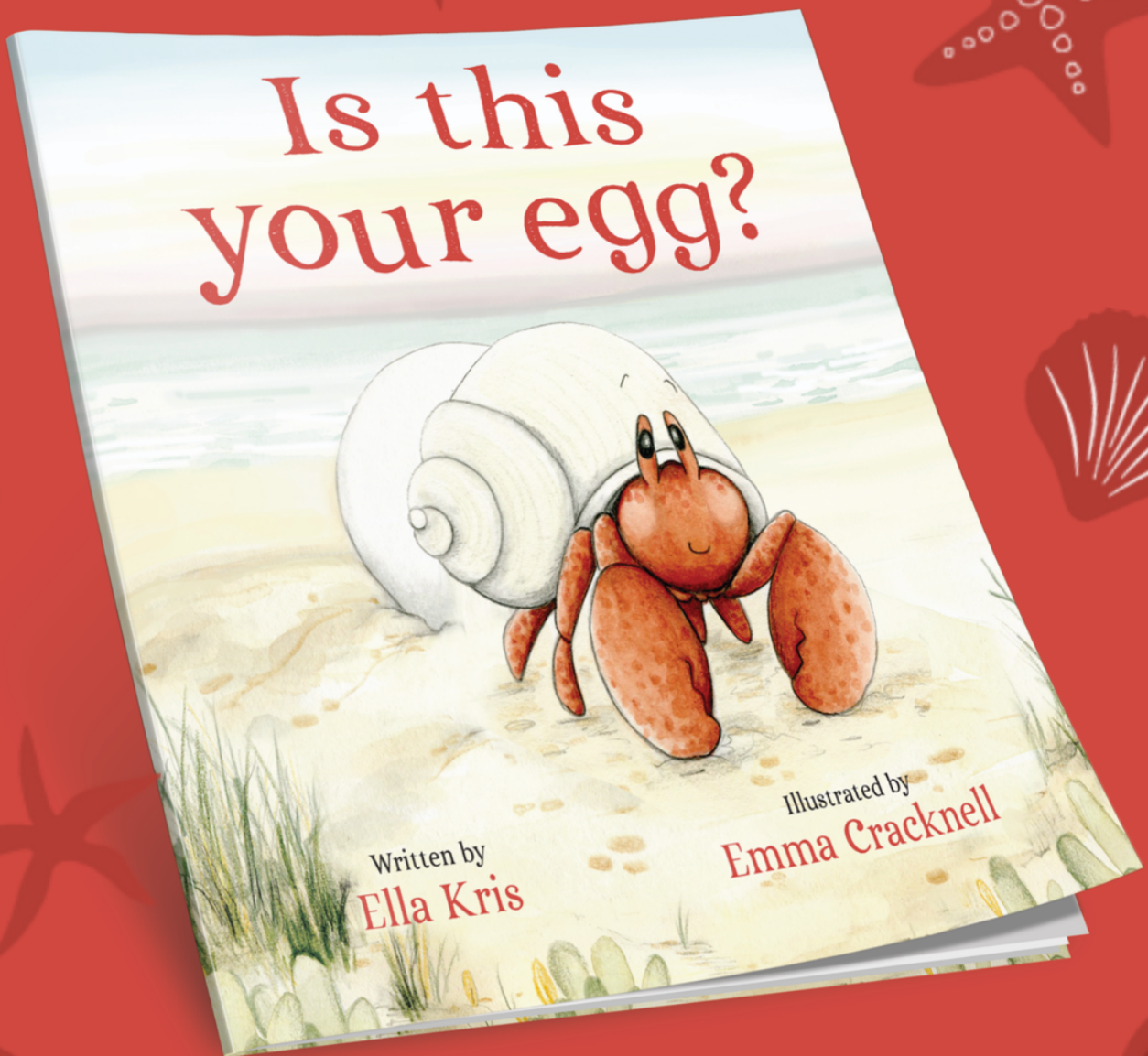

ABOUT FIRST 5 FOREVER

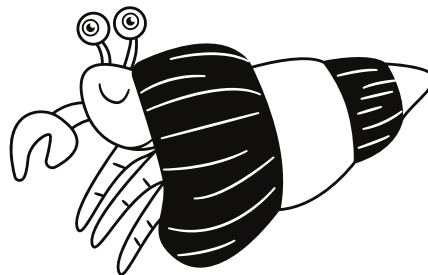
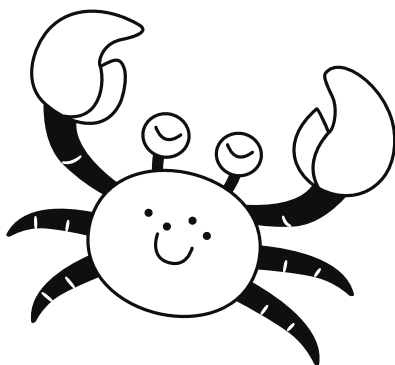
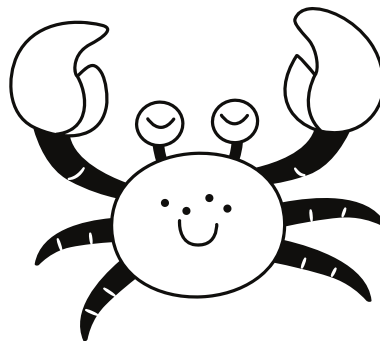
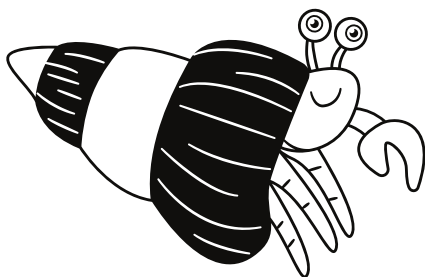
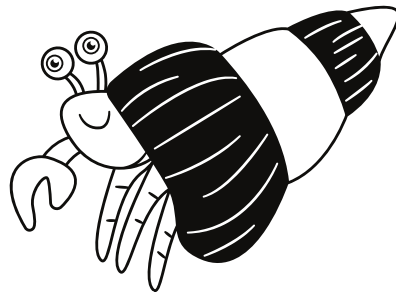
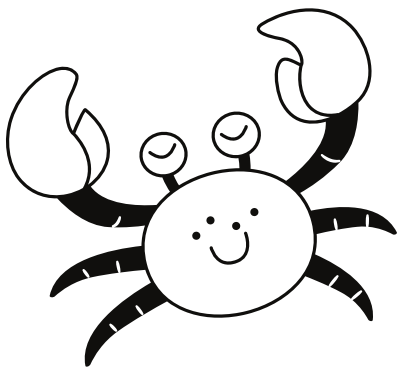

He hid between the jagged rocks.

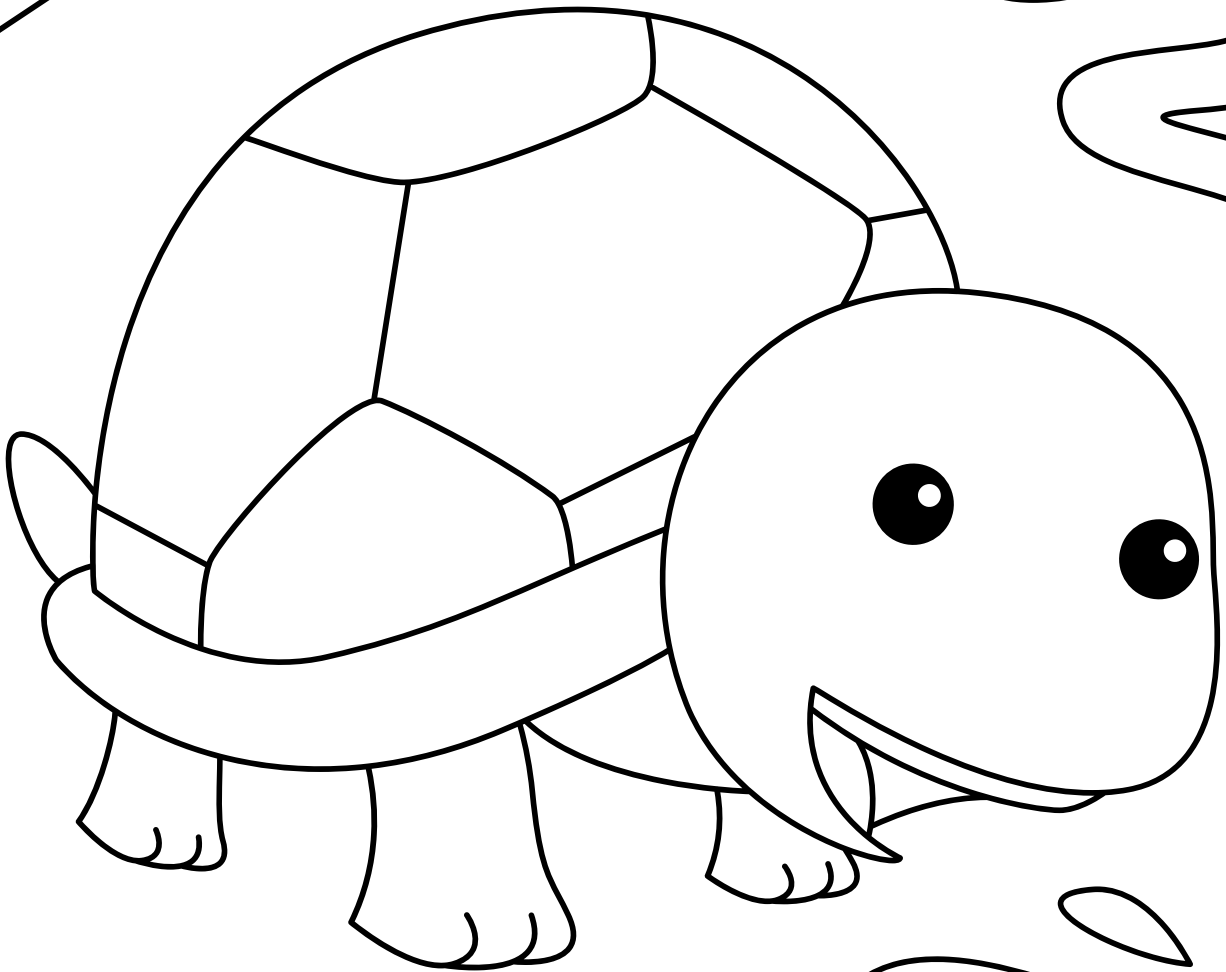
